
Franche Community Primary School **Autumn 1 2019 Year Six Newsletter**



Topic:

This half term, Year Six will be going back in time to the Ancient Greek civilization. On returning, the children were greeted by some very special visitors: 5 Gods. This will then lead into them writing non-chronological reports on one of the 12 Olympians. Following that, we will consider how the Ancient Greeks influenced modern society by exploring government and schooling. In History, we will explore the timeline of Greek history and significant events, lifestyles and architecture .
